Growers' Tip

This month's tip is to repot now, repot now. repot now! With the variation of climate, we now have it is imperative that you start your repotting schedule sooner rather than later. I now start in August; whereas once the general rule was to start in September/October. Without getting into the climate change debate, in Rocky we now have more temperatures in the high 30's in September and October. For instance, on the 8thOctober we had 41 degrees. If you think that's not hot, for us oldies it equates to 105.8 degrees Fahrenheit. Many of us grow Cattleyas, which is the most commonly cultivated genera. In my experience the longer you leave these to be repoted before the onslaught of the heat the longer they take to re-establish. The traditional potting media of bark and charcoal is not overly moisture retentive and therefore requires more regular watering while growing new roots. Observation can be your best tool; new /emerging roots will die-back if it is too hot and the media is dry. because it too becomes very hot in over 35 degree temps. An interesting concept to circumvent this problem is the advent of the

use of the semi-hydroponic method of cultivation with clay balls that is becoming popular with many growers. Time will tell, how it goes; it may be the potting method of the future; however, don't delay repotting any longer. 67
