



Loading the batteries

Two AA non-rechargeable starter batteries are included with your camera.




- **1** Make sure the Mode dial is set to Off (see page 4).
- **2** On the bottom of the camera, slide the battery door and lift to open.



- **3** Insert the AA batteries, as shown.
- **4** Close the battery door.



If you purchased an optional Kodak EasyShare Ni-MH rechargeable battery pack (also included with the Kodak EasyShare camera dock or printer dock), insert it as shown.



If you purchased an optional Kodak CRV3 lithium battery (non-rechargeable), insert it as shown.


Important battery information

Battery safety and handling

- Do not allow batteries to touch metal objects, including coins. Otherwise, a battery may short circuit, discharge energy, become hot, or leak.

Kodak battery replacement types/battery life

Use the following types of batteries. Actual battery life may vary based on usage.

We do not recommend or support alkaline batteries. For acceptable battery life, and to make sure your camera operates dependably, use the replacement batteries listed above.

Extending battery life

- Limit the following activities that quickly deplete battery power:
 - Reviewing your pictures on the camera screen (see page 20)
 - Excessive use of the flash
 - Using the camera screen as a viewfinder (see page 10)

Kodak EasyShare camera dock—powers your camera, transfers pictures to your computer, and charges the included Kodak EasyShare Ni-MH rechargeable battery pack.

Kodak EasyShare printer dock—powers your camera, makes 4 x 6 in. (10 x 15 cm) prints with or without a computer, transfers pictures, and charges the included Kodak EasyShare Ni-MH rechargeable battery pack.

Kodak 3-volt AC adapter—powers your camera.



A CAUTION:

Do not use a 5-volt AC adapter (included with the Kodak EasyShare camera dock and printer dock) to power your camera.

- Dirt on the battery contacts can affect battery life. Wipe the contacts with a clean, dry cloth before loading batteries in the camera.
- Battery performance is reduced at temperatures below 41° F (5° C). When using your camera in cold weather, carry spare batteries and keep them warm. Do not discard cold batteries that do not work; when they return to room temperature, they may be usable.

Turning the camera on and off



■ Turn the Mode dial from Off to any other position.

The ready light blinks green while the camera performs a self-check, then glows green when the camera is ready.

■ To turn off the camera, turn the Mode dial to Off

The camera completes operations that are in process.

Selecting a language

Selecting a language, first time

The Language screen appears the first time you turn on the camera.

■ Press → to highlight a language, then press the OK button.

The Set Date & Time screen is displayed in the language you selected (see Setting the date and time, first time).

- 2 Press ▲/▼ to highlight Setup Menu \(\overline{\overl
- **3** Highlight Language ABC, then press the OK button.
- **4** Highlight a language, then press the OK button.
- **5** Press the Menu button to exit.

Setting the date and time

Setting the date and time, first time

The Date & Time have been reset message appears after the Language screen the first time you turn on the camera. It may also appear if the batteries are removed for an extended time.

- 1 SET DATE & TIME is highlighted. Press the OK button. (Select CANCEL to set the date and time at a later time.)
- 2 Go to Step 4 below, Setting the date and time, anytime.

Setting the date and time, anytime

- 1 In any mode, press the Menu button.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ to highlight Setup Menu \(\opi \), then press the OK button.
- 3 Highlight Date & Time **\$\mathbb{Z}_{\backstyle}\$**, then press the OK button.
- **4** Press ▲/▼ to adjust the date and time. Press ◀/▶ to advance to the next setting.
- **5** When finished, press the OK button.
- **6** Press the Menu button to exit.





Storing pictures and videos on an SD/MMC card


Your camera has 16 MB of internal memory. You can purchase optional SD/MMC cards for removable, reusable storage for pictures and videos.



CAUTION:

Insert card as shown. Forcing it may damage the camera or card.

Do not insert or remove a card when the green ready light is blinking; doing so may damage your pictures, card, or camera.



To insert an SD/MMC card:

- **1** Turn off the camera and open the card door.
- **2** Orient the card as shown.
- **3** Push the card into the slot to seat the connector and close the card door.
 - To remove the card, turn off the camera. Push the card in, then release it. When the card is partially ejected, pull it out.

NOTE: When using a card for the first time, we suggest you format it before you take pictures (see page 19).

To set the image storage location, see page 15. For SD/MMC card storage capacities, see Image storage capacities, page 45.

Taking pictures and videos

The camera is ready to take pictures or videos when you turn it on—even if you are in Review, Share, or Setup.

Taking a picture

- 1 Turn the Mode dial to the Still mode you want to use. See page 9 for mode descriptions.
 - The camera screen temporarily displays the mode name and description. To interrupt the description, press any button.
- 2 Use the viewfinder or camera screen to frame your subject. (Press the OK button to turn on the camera screen. See page 10.)

NOTE: The position of pictures captured using the viewfinder may differ from pictures taken using the camera screen (especially in Close-up mode or when using zoom). For best results, use the camera screen to frame your subject.



- **3** Press the Shutter button **halfway and hold** to set the exposure and focus.
- 4 When the ready light turns green, continue press the Shutter button **the rest of the way down** to take the picture.

When the ready light blinks green, the picture is being saved; you can still take pictures. If the ready light is red, wait until it turns green.

Taking a video

- 1 Turn the Mode dial to Video
- **2** Use the camera screen to frame your subject.
- **3** Press the Shutter button and release. To stop recording, press the Shutter button again.

NOTE: You can also press the Shutter button **and hold it** for more than 2 seconds to begin recording. To stop recording, release the Shutter button.

Recording stops if image storage is full (see Video storage capacity, page 46).

Capture modes

Using the camera screen as a viewfinder

NOTE: To prolong battery life, use the Liveview feature sparingly.

- **3** Frame your subject in the camera screen.
- 4 Press the Shutter button halfway and hold to set the exposure and focus. When the framing marks turn red, focus is

NOTE: Framing marks appear only when the camera screen is on. Framing marks do not appear in Landscape or Video mode.

Reviewing the picture or video just taken

After you take a picture or video, it appears on the camera screen for approximately 5 seconds. While it is displayed, you can:

- **Review:** If you take no action, the picture/video is saved.
- Play (video): Press the OK button to play the video.
- **Share:** Press the Share button to tag a picture/video for email, or as a Favorite, or to tag a picture for print (see page 29).
- **Delete:** Press the Delete button while the picture/video and 前 are displayed.

NOTE: Only the final picture of a burst series (see page 14) is displayed. If you select Delete, all pictures in the burst series are deleted. To delete selectively, do so in Review (see page 21).

Using optical zoom

Use optical zoom to get up to 2X closer to your subject. Optical zoom is effective when the lens is no closer than 19.7 in. (50 cm) to the subject. You can change optical zoom before (but not during) video recording.



- Zoom indicator

- 1 Use the camera screen to frame your subject (see page 10).
- 2 Press the Telephoto (T) button to zoom in. Press the Wide Angle (W) button to zoom out. The zoom indicator on the camera screen shows when you are in optical or digital zoom.
- **3** Take a picture or video as usual.

Using digital zoom

Use digital zoom in any Still mode to get an additional 3X magnification beyond optical zoom. Combined zoom settings are from 2.1X to 6.0X. You must turn on the camera screen to activate digital zoom.

IMPORTANT: You may notice a decrease in printed image quality when using digital zoom. The blue slider on the zoom indicator pauses, then turns red when the picture quality is less than 1 MP. For an acceptable 4 x 6 in. (10 x 15 cm) print, ensure that the slider remains blue.

- **1** Press the OK button to turn on the camera screen.
- **2** Press the Telephoto (T) button to the optical zoom limit (2X). Release the button, then press it again.
 - The camera screen displays the zoomed image and the zoom indicator.
- **3** Press the Shutter button **halfway and hold** to set the exposure and focus, then press **the rest of the way down** to take the picture.

NOTE: You cannot use digital zoom for video recording.

Using the flash


Use the flash when you take pictures at night, indoors, or outdoors in heavy shadows.

NOTE: Flash is unavailable in Video mode.

Choosing a flash option

Press the **5** button to scroll through the flash options. The active flash icon is displayed in the camera screen status area.

Putting yourself in the picture or video

Use Self Timer to create a 10-second delay between the time you press the Shutter button and the time the picture or video is taken.

- 1 Turn the Mode dial to any Still mode for pictures, or to Video for videos, then press the Menu button.
- 2 Press →/▼ to highlight Self Timer ♦, then press the OK button.
- **3** Highlight On, then press the OK button.
- **4** Press the Menu button to turn off the menu screen. The Self Timer icon **(*)** is displayed in the status area.
- **5** Place the camera on a flat surface or use a tripod.
- **6** Compose the scene. Take a picture or video as usual, then move so that you are in the scene.

The Self Timer light blinks slowly for 8 seconds (then quickly for 2 seconds) before the picture is taken.

The Self Timer turns off after you take the picture or if you change modes.

NOTE: The default video length is Unlimited. The video will stop when you press the Shutter button or when no storage space remains. To change the video length, see Video Length, page 15.

Self Timer is disabled if Burst is on (see page 14).

Pre-tagging for album names

Use the Set Album (Still or Video) feature to pre-select album names before you take pictures. Then, all the pictures or videos you take are tagged with those album names.

First—on your computer

Use Kodak EasyShare software, V 3.0 or higher (see Installing the software, page 27), to create album names on your computer, then copy up to 32 album names to the camera's internal memory. See the EasyShare software Help for details.

Second—on your camera

- 1 In any mode, press the Menu button.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ to highlight Set Album (Still or Video) █ , then press the OK button.
- **3** Highlight an album name, then press the OK button. Repeat to select more than one album name.
 - Selected albums are noted with a check mark.
- **4** To remove a selection, highlight the album name then press the OK button. To remove all album selections, select Clear All.
- **5** Highlight Exit, then press the OK button. Your selections are saved. If you turn on the camera screen, your album selection appears on the screen. A plus (+) after the album name means more than one album is selected.
- **6** Press the Menu button to exit. This setting remains until you change it.

Third—transfer to your computer

When you transfer the tagged pictures and videos to your computer, Kodak EasyShare software opens and categorizes your pictures and videos in the appropriate album folder. See the EasyShare software Help for details.

Customizing your camera

Use the Setup Menu to customize your camera settings.

- **1** Press the Menu button.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ to highlight Setup Menu 🚍, then press the OK button.
- **3** Highlight the setting you wish to change, then press the OK button.

Reviewing pictures and videos

Press the Review button to view and work with your pictures and videos. To save battery power, purchase a Kodak 3-volt AC adapter or place your camera in a compatible Kodak EasyShare camera dock or printer dock.

Purchase these and other accessories at a dealer of Kodak products, or visit www.kodak.com/go/cx7220accessories.

Remember, you can press the Shutter button to take a picture anytime—even in Review.

Viewing single pictures and videos

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press ◀/▶ to scroll backward or forward through pictures and videos. (For fast scrolling, press and hold ◀/▶).
- **3** Press the Review button to exit.

NOTE: Pictures taken at the Best (3:2) quality setting are displayed at a 3:2 aspect ratio with a black bar at the top of the screen.

Viewing multiple pictures and videos

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press .

NOTE: You can also press the Menu button, highlight Multi-up ***, then press the OK button.

Thumbnails of pictures and videos appear.

- To display the previous or next row of thumbnails, press /.
- \blacksquare To scroll through the thumbnails one at a time, press $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$.
- To display a single view of the selected picture, press the OK button.
- **3** Press the Review button to exit.

Playing a video

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press **√/**▶ to locate a video (or to highlight one in multiple view).
- **3** Press the OK button to play or pause a video.

NOTE: You can also press the Menu button, highlight Play Video 💏, then press the OK button.

- To rewind a video, press during playback.
- To replay the video, press the OK button.
- To go to the previous or next picture or video, press
- 4 Press the Review button to exit.

NOTE: The camera does not have a built-in speaker. There is no sound during playback.

Deleting pictures and videos

- **1** Press the Review button.
- 2 Press **◄/**► to locate a picture or video (or highlight one in multiple view), then press the Delete button.
- **3** Press **△/** to highlight an option, then press the OK button:

PICTURE or VIDEO—deletes the displayed picture or video.

EXIT—exits the Delete screen.

ALL—deletes all pictures and videos from your current image storage location.

- To view and delete other pictures and videos, go to Step 2.
- **4** To exit, highlight Exit then press the OK button; or just press the Delete button again.

NOTE: You cannot delete protected pictures and videos without first removing protection (see page 23).

Magnifying pictures

- **1** Press the Review button, then locate a picture.
- **2** To magnify at 2X, press the OK button. To magnify at 4X, press the OK button again. To redisplay the picture at the 1X (original) size, press the OK button again.

NOTE: You can also press the Menu button, highlight Magnify **Q**, then press the OK button. *The picture is magnified. The magnification value is displayed.*

- Press ▲/▼ ◀/▶ to see different parts of the picture.
- To locate a different picture, press **4/**▶.
- To exit Magnify, press the Menu button.
- **3** Press the Review button to exit.

Protecting pictures and videos from deletion

- 1 Press the Review button, then locate the picture or video to protect.
- **2** Press the Menu button.
- **3** Press \triangle to highlight Protect \triangle , then press the OK button. The picture or video is protected and cannot be deleted. The Protect icon \triangle is displayed in the status area.
 - To remove protection, press the OK button again.
- 4 Press the Menu button to exit.



A CAUTION:

Formatting internal memory or SD/MMC card deletes all (including protected) pictures and videos. Formatting internal memory also deletes email addresses, album names, and Favorites. To restore them, see the Kodak EasyShare software Help.

Tagging pictures and videos for albums

Use the Album feature during Review to tag the pictures and videos in your camera with album names.

First—on your computer

Use Kodak EasyShare software (V 3.0 or higher) to create album names on your computer, then copy up to 32 album names to the camera's internal memory. See the EasyShare software Help for details.

Second—on your camera

- Press the Review button.
- 2 Press **√/** to locate a picture or video, then press the Menu button.
- 3 Press ▲/▼ to highlight Album ■, then press the OK button.

- **4** Highlight an album folder, then press the OK button.
 - The album name appears with the picture. A plus (+) after the album name means the picture was added to more than one album.
 - To add other pictures to the same album, press ***/** to scroll through the pictures. When the picture you want appears, press the OK button.
 - To add the pictures to more than one album, repeat Step 4 for each album.
 - To remove a selection, highlight an album name, then press the OK button.
 - To remove all album selections, select Clear All.
- **5** Highlight Exit, then press the OK button. Your selections are saved.
- **6** Press the Menu button to return to the Review screen.

Third—transfer to your computer

When you transfer the tagged pictures and videos to your computer, Kodak EasyShare software opens and categorizes your pictures and videos in the appropriate album folder. See the EasyShare software Help for details.

Running a slide show

Use the Slide Show to display your pictures and videos on the camera screen. To run a slide show on a television or on any external device, see page 25. To save battery power, use an optional Kodak 3-volt AC adapter. Purchase this and other accessories at a dealer of Kodak products, or visit www.kodak.com/go/cx7220accessories.

Starting the slide show

- **1** Press the Review button, then press the Menu button.
- 2 Press / to highlight Slide Show , then press the OK button.
- **3** Highlight Begin Show, then press the OK button. Each picture and video appears once, in the order in which you took them.
- **4** To interrupt the Slide Show, press the OK button.

Changing the slide show display interval

The default interval setting displays each picture for 5 seconds. You can increase the display interval to up to 60 seconds.

- 1 On the Slide Show menu, press / to highlight Interval, then press the OK button.
- 2 Select a display interval. To scroll through the seconds quickly, press and hold /-.
- **3** Press the OK button.

 This setting remains until you change it.

Running a continuous slide show loop

When you turn on Loop, the slide show is continuously repeated.

- 2 Highlight On, then press the OK button.

 The next time you run a slide show, it repeats until you press the OK button or until battery power is exhausted. This setting remains until you change it.

Displaying pictures and videos on a television

You can display pictures and videos on a television, computer monitor, or any device equipped with a video input using a compatible Kodak EasyShare printer dock and an optional audio/video (A/V) cable. See the printer dock user's guide for details. (Image quality on a television screen may not be as good as on a computer monitor or when printed.)

Copying pictures and videos

Tags that you applied for print, email, and Favorites are not copied. Protection settings are not copied. To apply protection to a picture or video, see page 23.

Viewing picture and video information

- 2 Press / to highlight Picture Info or Video Info , then press the OK button.
- **3** To view information on the next or previous picture or video, press **1/**.
- 4 Press the Menu button to exit.



Tips, safety, maintenance

 - **2** Wipe the lens or camera screen gently with a soft, lint-free cloth or an untreated lens-cleaning tissue.

Do not use cleaning solutions unless they are designed specifically for camera lenses. Do not wipe the camera lens or camera screen with chemically treated eyeglass lens tissue. It may scratch the lens.

- Wipe the outside of the camera with a clean, dry cloth. Never use harsh or abrasive cleaners or organic solvents on the camera or any of its parts.
- Connect a tripod directly to the camera; do not connect a tripod to the camera dock or printer dock.
