





VALE Jean Slattery

Jean Slattery 1918 - 2014

Jean Wren Slattery died Monday 31st March 2014 aged 95.

Jean Slattery was married to Frank Slattery after they met in Toowoomba where Jean (nee Flynn) was the Secretary of the Toowoomba Orchid Society. Frank Slattery was one of the elder statesmen of the Orchid Society of NSW who passed away in 2000. Jean and Frank ran an Orchid Nursery at Bexley. The Slattery's quarantine house, housed many of the orchids imported up to the late 1980's.

Frank and Jean were the mainstays of the St George Orchid Society until 1993; Jean was the secretary keeping the Society together for over 30 years.

Jean ran the floral art section of the Orchid Society of NSW. Jean was an excellent floral art teacher and organised floral art classes for orchids and set the floral art judging schedules for the major NSW shows and many of the affiliated society shows. The floral art under Jean's guidance became a feature of the meetings of OSNSW Ladies Auxiliary Meetings.

Jean was patron of Bankstown Orchid Society for many years and the Secretary of the NSW Royal Horticultural Society.

Jean was also an RHS floral art judge, judging at orchid shows and garden club shows in NSW. In 1993 Jean Received the Order of Australia Medal for Services to the Royal Horticultural Society of NSW, recognising 30 years of work for the society in floral art.

Jean became ill in the 1980s and withdrew from Judging. Unfortunately the floral art sections of the shows withered without Jean's Leadership.

Jean will be remembered by all those who knew her.





The proposed date is 27th September with a visit to the EDOS show (always worth seeing), then off to Beerwah show and lunch, then a private nursery and back home at a reasonable hour. More details as they come to hand but pencil the date in your diary.

<u>Sam Tsui Visit</u> Renowned grower and hybridist Sam Tsui of Orchid Inn USA from Bloomington Illinois is visiting us at our August meeting (22nd August). He will be talking to us on the culture and hybridisation of the Brachypetalum group of Paphiopedilums. Sam will also be publishing a flask list prior to his visit. Flasks are to be ordered prior and picked up on the night. The quality of hybridisation will be top rate so I urge members if you are interested in only half the plants in one flask, let us know as someone else may "need" the other half thus enabling a purchase and some more wonderful orchids for our meetings and shows at some time in the future.

Some General notes on Brachypetalum and Parvisepalum Culture

I would say at the outset, these are my personal observations on the general culture of these two Paph. groups in the SEQld region. I won't discuss the detail of growing structures in this article, but suffice to say that solid roof cover is essential to grow these plants well over the long term.

As any grower will have observed, there can be wide variations in growth/vigour and ease of culture even within the one species, let alone once hybrids are made. Nevertheless, there are some general rules that seem to apply to most plants within the above two sections. I use the same potting medium for both groups, being 10mm treated bark, 10mm charcoal, Super coarse perlite and some shell grit. Fertilize weekly with a balanced liquid feed, perhaps with a higher nitrogen formula in the early Spring and Summer months, and a blossom booster formulation in the Autumn.

PARVISEPALUM



For beginner growers, in my opinion, it is best to stick with the primary hybrids made with species from within the parvi group.

These tend to yield similar blooms to the species, but are quicker to mature, flower more reliably, and are more forgiving of less than ideal culture than are the species. As an

example, P. Magic Lantern is far easier to grow and flower than is P. *micranthum* (above), and P. Norito Hasegawa is similarly easier than P. *armeniacum*. Both of these primaries have the best features of both parents but tend to be far more prolific. In my view, depending on the other parent, P. *malipoense* hybrids can make some of the most robust and rewarding plants especially for newer growers, being relatively quick to mature, and reliable bloomers.



P. Lynleigh Koopowitz (left) is one obvious example, with the added bonus of fragrance. Those hybrids made with P. hangianum/emersonii can be outstanding, but be mindful that these can also be slow to mature. Intersectional hybrids (ie. with the Coryopedalum or Cochlopetalum group) can also be very good, but do tend to be more


variable than pure parvi primaries in terms of flower quality, floriferousness and vigour. Once the culture of the primaries has been mastered, by all means have a go at some of the species. Personally, in our growing environment, P. *malipoense* and P. *delenatii* have been the easiest to grow and flower regularly, with the other parvi species less so. Like any Paph, regular repotting is not

only essential, but beneficial, and where plants have lost their roots for whatever reason, very frequent repotting (ie. 6 monthly) into the smallest pot that will accommodate the healthy roots that

are left, can be very effective in promoting new root growth. This group tends to be fairly tolerant of both heat and cold, and seems to handle the many climatic variations that we experience in this region without too many adverse effects. This might include temperature extremes of near 0°C in Winter up to say 35°C in Summer along with large variations in humidity levels.

BRACHYPETALUM

Arguably one of the more difficult groups to grow well over the long term. We are fortunate to normally experience a hot, wet summer and cool dry winters in our region which does however tend to assist with the culture of this group.





particularly in the winter months when this group really does prefer reduced watering and fertilizing frequency. This can be difficult to manage when different groups are grown randomly mixed in together. Ideally, the growing environment should also warm up sufficiently during the day in the winter months so that once plants have been watered, they are able to dry off sufficiently before nightfall. Overwatering and a stale potting medium through the winter months can be fatal for most pure Brachypetalums. Therefore, fresh potting medium, not over potting along with adequate air movement are essential factors in growing this group well.



In my opinion, P. *concolor* is the more robust of the species, followed by P. *niveum* (at left). My view is that, depending on the combination, primaries are generally more tolerant of less than ideal conditions than are the species, and some commonly seen examples are P. Greyii (*niveum* x *godefroyae*),

P. Wellesleyanum (*godefroyae* x *concolor*) and P. S. Gratrix (*bellatulum* x *godefroyae*). Some of the brachy- parvi intersectional hybrids (particularly those involving P. *delenatii*) can be significantly easier to grow than pure Brachypetalums, whilst still producing flowers that are similar in form, and this style is best suited to new growers who are keen to try this group.

Barbatum Alliance: Paph. *appletonianum*, Paph. *barbatum*, Paph. *callosum*, Paph. *sukhakulii*, Paph. *superbiens* var curtisii, Paph. *tonsum* & Paph. *venustum*.

Brachypetalum Alliance: Paph. concolor

Cochleopetalum Alliance; Paph. glaucophyllum, Paph. primulinum & Paph. victoria-regina

Insigne Alliance: Paph. charlesworthii, Paph. exul, Paph. gratrixianum, Paph. henryanum, Paph. insigne & Paph.

villosum.

Multifloral Alliance: Paph. haynaldianum, Paph. lowii & Paph. philippinense.

Parvisepalum Alliance: Paph. delenatii & Paph. malipoense.

As you see in the article by John Robertson, hybrids can be easier to grow than most species having what is called "hybrid vigour". This does not apply to some hybrids made outside their alliance as they can be difficult and painfully slow to grow. If in doubt ask an experienced grower.



A word of explanation: - Members at the last meeting saw me present Rick Emmerson with a certificate of his graduation to master grower status. I've been asked just what that means.


When a new member joins the club they start out in the novice grower section of competition. For each plant they bring to a meeting (up to 10) they receive one point for each. Should they win a class at a meeting or show they receive 5 points. A champion of section gets 10 points, reserve champion of show is rewarded with 25 points and grand champion of show earns 50 points. An AOC quality award gained by a member also earns points: 100 for a HCC or equivalent, 200 for an AM or equivalent and 500 points for an FCC. When the novice grower attains 150 points they graduate to open class and can no longer exhibit in the novice section. When this same grower reaches 1000 points they are then elevated to master growers status which is quite a feather in their cap.



Plant Auction. Last meeting we held another successful plant auction to help raise some much needed funds for our Diamond Jubilee Conference next year. The event raised another \$236. 
